Funding Received:

- Pupils eligible: 180
- Funding rate: £16,000 plus £10 per pupil
- Total amount received: £17,800

Objectives:

- increase pupil participation in competitions, events and interschool sport.
- ensure children meet the recommended daily exercise of 30 minutes.
- improve resources and equipment to support the teaching of PE.
- provide transport to Sporting opportunities and competitions.
- ensure that children's progress and attainment is carefully assessed.
- create an encouraging and supporting environment for all children
- continue to promote the enjoyment of sport and physical activity

Spending Focus for 2018/19:

- Remain a part of Eden Valley Sports Partnership (EVSP)
 - o Increase pupil participation in competitions, events and interschool sport
 - o Receive allocation of high quality sports coaches
- Encourage all staff to use Maths of the Day
 - o Increase pupil participation in physical activity

- Ensure all children meet the recommended 30 minutes of exercise a day at school
- Use Active Cumbria Assessment Scheme across school
 - Provide a way of assessing children's progress and attainment
 - Monitor children's participation in physical activity
 - To help children meet the recommended 30 minutes of exercise at school
- Hiring external coaches to support in delivery PE lessons
 - Improve the quality of lessons
 - Encourage children to love and enjoy sport and physical activity
- Coach hire to transport to sporting events and swimming lessons
 - Provide transport to PE and sporting competitions and events
- Improve the resources and equipment to support the teaching of PE
 - New netball posts
 - New sporting team kit

Measuring the Impact of Premium Funding:

- Impact on pupil's participation in sport
 - High percentage of pupils participated in school competitions.
 - Events highlighted to target children with less confidence; Multi-Skills, come and try it sessions and basic moves
 - All classes received an external coach at some point during the year (Dance, Gymnastics)
- Impact on pupil's progress and attainment in sport
 - Reaching Eden District Finals in Football, Netball, Tag-Rugby and Tri-Golf
 - Cumbria School games: winners in Orienteering, runners up in Netball and Hockey
- Increase the number of pupils meeting the recommended daily exercise
 - Specialist coaches creating a higher interest and confidence in a wider range of sports
 - 100 mile challenge
 - Feet First Scheme
 - School equipment available at breaks and lunches (netballs and netball posts set up at breaks and lunch, footballs and football goals set up at breaks and lunch).

How to maintain this throughout 2018/19

- Impact on pupil's participation in sport
 - Spreadsheet to record participation of pupils at sporting events
 - Run afterschool sporting clubs, paid and unpaid
- Impact on pupil's progress and attainment in sport
 - Use Active Cumbria Assessment Scheme
 - Meet with staff to support use of assessment
- Increase the number of pupil's meeting recommended daily exercise
 - Maintain use of specialist sports coaches
 - Run 100 mile challenge in school

- Maintain use of Feet First scheme and encourage use
- Year 6 PE monitors to ensure equipment is available at breaks and lunches and to monitor upkeep of equipment used at breaks and lunch

School Sport and PE Coordinators Role

- Provide support and encourage use of Active Cumbria Assessment Scheme
- Ensure equipment is safe to use and perform audits of any equipment needed
- Annual written reports to celebrate achievements and highlight areas for improvement
